



## Extended Schools Report May 2010



In line with the "every child matters" agenda Clarice Cliff Primary continues to provide access to the core offer of integrated services. All 5 areas of the Extended Schools agenda are fully supported.

The following additional extended school activities have taken place since February 2010.

- ✓ Our School choir have been invited to back to sing at the North Staffs University Hospital for their 1<sup>st</sup> anniversary. This will take place on the 30<sup>th</sup> June 2010.
- ✓ Links continue to strengthen with both our local Children's Centre. They have been invited to attend our nursery intake sessions during next half term. The display board advertising events at Fenton children's centre is also available to all parents in our main entrance.
- ✓ The breakfast nurture group for KS2 is well established supporting vulnerable pupils in KS2. This is run by myself and Mrs Woodward.
- ✓ Our Y6 children took part in a new venture called "Policing for Success" This was run jointly between our Community Beat Police Officers and Education and was aimed at level 4 target children. All 6 sessions were held at Longton Police Station before Easter and were very successful, and popular with all children.
- ✓ Our school nurses and local police officers continue to take an active role in school life. This term talks on attending school, anti-bullying, road safety and sex education are already in the diary.
- ✓ First Steps Psychological Services have been running the Lifestyle Triple P course here at Clarice Cliff Primary this term. This is a positive parenting course with a focus also on Healthy lifestyles and a number of our families have engaged with the program.
- ✓ The disadvantage subsidy funding has been launched with 8 of our vulnerable families. The funding assists children in engaging with extra curricular activities.
- ✓ Clarice Cliff Primary has again enrolled with the Parent Support Coordinator Project via the extended services team. Sue Nickisson is running projects such as transition, family learning and attendance focussing on greater parental support, involvement and communication.
